## Summer Rehearsals

Wed May 29th, Thu May 30th, Tue July 2nd, Wed July 3rd: Full Band (8:00AM - 11:00AM)
During these rehearsals, students will learn the music and choreography of the halftime shows. The music needs to be memorized by August, so these rehearsals help students get ready for Band Camp Week. We will teach songs that will be played in the stands at football games, basketball games, assemblies, and other events as well. This camp will also cover the basic marching skills needed for our show and the 4th of July Parade.

## JULY 4th PARADE

Call time 9:30 AM (but plan on arriving early, as parking is always at a premium on parade day) Parade Step off at 10:30 AM (we line up in the ACHS Parking lot and march down Main Street until we reach the library. Students will be dismissed from there. They will have to walk back to the band room to pack up. There is unfortunately no way we can drive the kids back to the school after the parade.

## BAND CAMP WEEK (\& RECAP)

## August 5-9 (Noon to 9:00PM) (Performance for family \& friends in the stadium at 8PM on Fri Aug 9th) August 13 \& 14 (5:00PM - 8:30PM)

Band Camp is the week where the band learns the halftime show. The students are expected to know their music and choreography before they come to this camp so that the majority of the week can be used to learn all of the drill positions on the field. This week is extremely important to the success of our season. If a student misses any day of this camp, they will fall behind very quickly and may be considered an alternate.
We will not accept absences for Band Camp Week unless a student is ill. If a student can not participate in band camp week, they are more than welcome to still be a part of the band, but they will be made an alternate for the show. Vacations, work, doctor's appointments, etc. are NOT valid reasons. Below is a sample schedule of what a typical day of band camp week will look like. Times within the day may change, but we will never let your students out late!

## Sample Schedule - Subject to change depending on the weather

11:30 Band Room Doors Open, Check-In (Eat lunch prior to noon start time)
12:00 Group Meeting in Auditorium
12:15-3:00 Music/Choreo Rehearsal
3:00-5:00 Marching Rehearsal
5:00-6:00 Dinner
6:00-9:00 Rehearsal in the stadium

Other important info for camp:

- Bring a sack lunch/dinner, or money for one of the fast food establishments across the street.
- Wear SCHOOL and WEATHER appropriate clothes that you can comfortably move around in.
- Bring sunscreen/hat/sunglasses in case we practice outside - ALWAYS bring a water bottle!!!!
- On the last day of camp, we will give a mini-performance for families in the stadium at 8:00 PM.


## FULL BAND REHEARSALS

Full band rehearsals will occur once per week from 6PM-8:30 starting the first full week of school. We recommend students arrive by $5: 15$ to make it to the stadium on time.

## COLOR GUARD SECTIONALS

Unless otherwise instructed, Color Guard will meet in the East Deck promptly at 3:30 on Fridays when there is no game or performance. The Section Leader will begin warm ups. (Check the whiteboard for updates)

## Rehearsal/Performance Norms

- Arrive on time ("on time" is at LEAST 15-30 minutes early - you will need to gather your instrument and/or equipment and be ready to go at practice/performance time).
- If you will be late or cannot attend a practice or performance, please EMAIL and/or text (through the Remind app) either Mr. Untch (for wind and percussion) or Coach B (for color guard) ASAP.
- Showing up more than 30 minutes late is considered an absence.
- Absences for illness, religious activities, and/or a school related sport or activity are excused.
- Absences for work, a non-school related sport or activity, and all others are UNEXCUSED.
- Unexcused tardies and absences in addition to struggling with music, marching, and/or choreography will require make-up time or be moved to an alternate spot.
- Before leaving a rehearsal or performance, ALL members should check that instruments and equipment are put away, the band room/surrounding areas are clean, and the guard closet is clean.
- Do NOT leave without checking in with your section leader.
- You are responsible to make sure that your instrument/equipment makes it to the rehearsal/performance AND that it gets back after. Coordinate with your section leader or another band member to ensure that your instrument/equipment gets there AND back.
- Save the DRAMA for your Ilama. We are here to practice, perform, learn, and have fun.
*In addition to scheduled practices, it is highly recommended that you attend any clinics or rehearsals offered by the section leaders or veteran members.


## REQUIRED FOR REHEARSALS/SECTIONALS

At every rehearsal and sectional, ALL BAND MEMBERS must have the following:

- Dot Book and Drill Chart Binder
- Instrument/Flags/Weapons/other props
- (Color Guard Only) Tape bag


## Rehearsal Dress:

- Winds and Percussion: Cardinal Marching Sequoits Shirt, Drillmaster Shoes
- Color Guard: Grey Shirt, Black Shoes


## FRIDAY AFTERNOON WORK SESSIONS

The Band Room will be open after school on Fridays from 3:30-4:15 for students who need help catching up on the music or marching. Students can work in small groups, or be able to work with a teacher one on one.

## PERFORMANCES (FOLLOW ALL REHEARSAL/PERFORMANCE NORMS - see above!!!!)

## Dates:

There are 4 or 5 home games per year. If the team has a home playoff game, we will perform. Details on playoff games won't be available until the week prior to the game, so we need to be flexible. In addition to home games, we may perform at university band day and/or competition(s), the 4th of July parade, the homecoming parade, and some school assemblies. Please see the calendars above and lists of dates below for more details.
